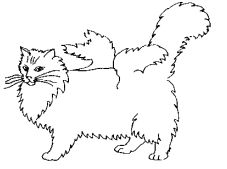

Wiveliscombe Area Website relaunched

Fresh up-to-date look with new content



Wiveliscombe.com has been getting a new lick of paint and a serious reorganisation over the last few months, and the team are now proud to unveil their new baby for all to see.

The purpose of the revamp was to give the site a fresher, more consistent and up-to-date look, reorganised and refresh the content, and make the site a key resource for information about the Wiveliscombe Area, for the benefit of residents and visitors alike.

The team consisted of Brian Collingridge and Tim Parker, representatives of Wiveliscombe Parish Council, Adam Hope, the administrator of the website over the last few years, Paul Cottingham, the Ten Parishes Project Co-ordinator, and

Dave Meehan, local computer expert and website developer.

The illustration shown is used as the homepage of the site and helps to set the scene for the Wiveliscombe Area.

It was created by Leo Hartas, an illustrator who lives in Tracebridge, who kindly gave his time and expertise to the project.

Groups and businesses alike are able to use the Wiveliscombe Area Website to promote their activities.

Businesses all receive a free listing in the Business Directory, giving contact information and links to their own website where available. Donations are requested from businesses who wish to have an expanded entry to promote their business.

In addition, there is space for advertising on all pages of the site, so various activities can be promoted as needed.
