WIVEY Colts have been making the headlines since our last report, continuing their run in the National Colts Cup Plate Competition.

The club's under 19 team has been playing exceedingly well considering they have been drawn away in every round in the competition, so far.

Before their quarter-final win over Ipswich, they played London Saracens away and beat the Southgate based team 13-5.

Star of the day was captain Tom Colley, playing in the centre; he scored two tries with Dan Hannaford adding a penalty.

Travelling to Cornwall in the previous round, Wivey beat Wadebridge Camel Coln by a convincing thirty points.

Wiveliscombe 1st XV find themselves in second position in the Somerset One League at the time of writing.

Defeats against Old Sullians from Bath 31-17 and Minehead in the Somerset Cup 13-5 with league victories over North Petherton (away) 11-29, Bristol Barbarians (home) 22-10, Crewkerne (away) 20-0 and Burnham On Sea (away) 21-10 have put Wivey in a position for promotion next season to the Somerset Premier League.

Club captain Eamon Bingham has made an excellent recovery from his dislocated shoulder and came through unscathed in the game against Burnham.

The 2nd and 3rd teams have had their games disrupted through unavailability and injuries.

This affected the second team performance in the

Merit Table games where they have struggled somewhat, with second team captain Stuart Lloyd breaking his thumb and partner Sophie Wickham breaking her collarbone playing for the Ladies on the same day.

One success for the seconds was a convincing 63-3 victory over Burnham-on-Sea seconds; six of the tries scored during the game came from brothers Richard (4) and Robert (2) Hardy.

Wivey Ladies have struggled to field a settled team but have still recorded the odd victory in their league programme, the most recent being a hard earned home win over Dorchester.
